e've unearthed a French beauty secret: green clay. Quarried from lake beds in France and pulverized into a fine cosmetic-grade powder, mineral clay makes a super doit-yourself cleansing and detoxify-

ing mask for any skin type, says makeup artist Efrat of Pierre Michel Salon in New York City. Mix up a gooey batch; slather on cheeks, forehead

and nose as a skin toner and freshener. Or apply—carefully—around the eyes to relieve puffiness.

The recipe: Mix two tablespoons of clay into a paste using bottled springwater or purified water.

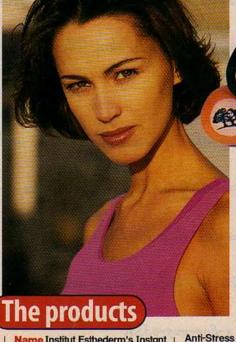
If you have oily skin: Add one tablespoon of lemon juice. For normal skin: Add one mashed avocado or papaya. For dry skin: Add olive oil. Leave on for about 15 minutes and rinse off with tepid water. A tablespoonful or two of the clay mixed with a few drops of water is also a handy emergency spot treatment for blemishes—left on for 15 minutes, it will absorb excess oil. The Proscar treatment

A drug used for treating enlarged prostate glands in men may offer new hope to women with thinning hair. Finasteride. also known as Proscar, is an antiandrogen that inhibits the production of dihydrotestosterone (DHT), the hormone triggering male-pattern baldness in men and women. During a recent study, those who ingested Proscar had significantly reduced levels of DHT. "I'm far more optimistic about Proscar than I was about minoxidil," says dermatologist Walter Unger, M.D., an associate professor of medicine at the University of Toronto, who was an early investigator for Rogaine. Note: DHT is vital to male potency, fertility and muscle tone, and all three could be affected by long-term use of Proscar. Pregnancy caution: The drug may also harm male fetuses. International clinical studies begin in January.
